NI Water Hunters Mill Project, Downpatrick (Planning Approval Reference R/2012/0179/F)


We are writing in relation to the above project to be carried out on behalf of Northern Ireland Water. As part of the scheme two existing combined sewer overflows are to be closed and replaced by one new overflow in the same vicinity. The existing overflows discharge to the Plank Drain in the vicinity of Thomas Russell Park as would the new replacement overflow. The new overflow will however only operate when the new proposed 1,380 m3 storm storage tank is full and it will also be fitted with bi directional 6mm screening. The net result of the storage provision is a significant reduction in the annual spill frequencies and volume as summarised below (from Drainage Area Study Model):-

Current CSOs:- Annual Spill Frequency: 50 Annual Spill Volume: 12,280 m³ Proposed New CSO Arrangement: - Annual Spill Volume: 1 Annual Spill Volume: 1,297 m³



To get back to you in relation to the application below. We have spoken to the modellers who have provided the relevant peak flow information.

The peak storm flow for the proposed new overflow would be 358I/s

The peak storm flow to the same culvert from the current overflow (located approx. 147m upstream of the proposed new discharge point) would be 446l/s ie. there is a net reduction in the peak discharge to the Rivers Agency culvert.

In addition to this as previously advised there will be a very significant drop in the frequency of discharges to the watercourse (annual spill frequency reduces from 50 to 1) and the new overflow will be screened.

In terms of detailing it is proposed to construct a new 1800mm manhole on the existing storm culvert and the new overflow would come in on a branch connection (see layout and standard manhole details drawing attached).

Thank you for your letter dated the 25th September 2012 referring to the above. From a drainage aspect my comments are as follows.

This site is adjacent to a watercourse known to Rivers Agency as the Town Drain (U3302) which is a designated watercourse under the terms of the Drainage (Northern Ireland) Order 1973.

Rivers Agency does not consent to your proposals to discharge the Emergency Overflow to the Town Drain as shown on drawing No. E1164 21 Rev C, due to existing infrastructural inadequacies downstream of the proposed discharge point.

Should you wish to discharge this emergency overflow to an alternative location on the watercourse you should resubmit your proposals to Rivers Agency for our consideration.

Rivers Agency would however consent to your other proposal of discharging 500l/s to the Quoile (and Annacloy) River which is a designated watercourse under the terms of the Drainage (Northern Ireland) Order 1973 as per drawing numbers, E1164 10 Rev B, E1164 42 Rev A and E1164 43 Rev A.

The overflow pipe should be turned in the direction of flow and anti scour measures taken to prevent bank and bed erosion.

The quality of discharge is outside the remit of Rivers Agency and you should seek consent / approval from the Northern Ireland Environment Agency (NIEA) in this regard.

In giving its consent the Agency would stress that it is your responsibility to ensure that the proposed works do not result in any obstruction to flow arising from blockage, structural failure, poor workmanship or any other reasons. Similarly, it is your responsibility to make provision for existing drainage.







Moreover, if in the future, another landowner wishes to drain land adjoining this site and within the same catchment he should not be prevented from doing so

This consent is valid for a period of 12 months from the date of this letter. If proposals are not completed within this period of time they should be resubmitted for further appraisal

Applicants should note that, in accordance with Para 11 of Schedule 6 of the Drainage (NI) Order 1973, any consent/approvals given by Rivers Agency under Schedule 6 Shall not affect the liability of any applicant to comply with other legislation relevant to works undertaken in pursuit of such consents/approvals.

It is your responsibility to obtain all necessary way leaves to carry out these works.





Figure 1 - General Site Location

I was given your contact details by



We are Project Managers for NI Water on their Hunters Mill Sewer Project in Downpatrick. As part of these works our contractor needs to carry out work in the vicinity of the existing Rivers Agency storm culvert (900mm concrete pipe) including a new twin 450mm pipe crossing below it.

At this location the storm pipe seems to have a standing water level at most times so to facilitate our work our contractor is proposing to put in a temporary pumping arrangement to pump this section of storm culvert down (by placing a temporary bung in the outgoing pipe to prevent backflows and over-pumping the incoming sewer to the storm culvert downstream (see attached sketch). This would only be undertaken during an appropriate dry period only and would be closely monitored.

Can you advise if Rivers Agency would permit them to carry out this procedure to facilitate the NIW work?

There is about 116m of 900mm pipe downstream from our connection point to where the culvert splits into twin pipes – BSG have estimated that it would take about 2 weeks with a regenerator to clear this (this costs £1000/day), so a ballpark cost of £10K for desilting plus a few hundred for cctv survey.

The River culverts/drain downstream of the 900mm pipe is heavily silted to the point where the pipe sits with a water level about 50% of the pipe until enough head builds to push flow through the system.

The feeling at the time was that you could clean the 900mm pipe only for the silt to fill back up in a short period due to the state of the ongoing system

NI Water considers it unreasonable to place a pre-condition that NI Water to fund essential maintenance activities that I understood are an obligation of Rivers Agency. I would also express concern that given the knowledge that these drains are heavily silted that Rivers Agency should prioritize de-silting of the designated drains and reduce the risk of flooding in Downpatrick.

Given this information could I ask you to re-consider Rivers Agency's requirements in regard to desilting funding and granting formal consent to discharge.

- 5. further indicated, that, previously the emergency overflow was activated approximately 50 times per year. He estimates that the new systen should now only discharge approximately once per year and that calculations indicated the annual emergency discharge volume should be reduced by approximately 0.66 in volume.
- 6. No figures were available for maximum discharge rates
- 7. Rivers Agency has not previously given consent or approved any discharge from the sewerage works to this culverted system, additionally no consent or approval had been given for the works/discharge recently carried out.
- 8. indicated that she was aware that consent had not been granted by Rivers Agency for any discharge from their works.
- 9. was aware that the matter had been referred to "Director" level of NIW and Rivers Agency in an effort to find an agreeable solution regarding discharge consent.

- 10. was unwilling to comment as to why works were completed prior to any solution having been agreed upon and without Rivers Agencys knowledge.
- 11. A manhole at the connection of the discharge pipe was opened however it was not possible to inspect the works as the pipes were drowned out and underwater.
- 12. It should be noted that an inspection of the open section of the Pemberton Park Stream downstream of the discharge point and at its confluence with the Plank Drain indicated that water levels in the sytem were low.
- 13. commented that a tideflex flap valve had been fitted to their system in a manhole approximately 3 metres from the connection point, however on inspection it was noted that there was no tideflex flap valve in the manhole and then said that it had been fitted inside the discharge pipe of a manhole adjacent to the new storage tank. M Robb pointed out that that arrangement would make maintenance of the flap valve very difficult, if not impossible
- 14. M Robb indicated that in light of the previous correspondence regarding discharges highlighting Rivers Agency's cornerns regarding lack of spare capacity and being aware that discussions had commenced some time ago (at a much higher level) then Rivers Agency would not presently grant retrospective consent for any discharge.
